UDALL SCHOLARSHIP - INDIAN COUNTRY CALL FOR APPLICATIONS

The Udall Scholarship provides up to \$7,000 for current sophomores and juniors* dedicated to careers related to Tribal Public Policy or Native Health Care. Udall Scholars pursue careers across a broad range of areas to make a difference for their tribes, Native Americans, or Alaska Natives.

BENEFITS

- Up to \$7,000 for educational expenses
- Participaiton in the Udall Scholar Orientation in Tucson, Arizona
- Membership in an active, national network of Udall Scholar Alumni

ELIGIBILITY

- Enrolled in a state or federally-recognized tribe or band, or the direct descendant of an enrolled member
- U.S. Citizen or permanent resident who is a member of the First Nations of Canada
- Current sophomore or junior* (*Students must have completed at least 3 semesters of college coursework after high school to be considered "sophomores" and be planning to graduate in Spring 2022 to be considered "juniors.")
- Strong record of commitment to Indian Country through participation in cultural activities or service
- KU may nominate up to four students in the Tribal Public Policy or Native Health Care categories

APPLICATION

Campus Deadline: January 7, 2021

To apply:

- Students should contact the Office of Fellowships to get access to the online application.
- For the campus stage, we do not need the application form or your transcript; we will access your KU advising report. If you have coursework not included on your KU record, you may submit that with the other materials.

The KU nominees will work with the Office of Fellowship to revise and update their application for the national competition.
